Dear Patient:

We look forward to your upcoming visit at Hawthorn Surgery Center. It is the policy of Hawthorn Surgery Center to notify you of the following information prior to your arrival at the center on your day of service:

1. Notice of Patient Rights and Responsibilities:

2. Physician Ownership Disclosure:

3. Center policy regarding Advance Directives including a description of applicable State health and safety laws:
 - A. You have the right to make choices regarding life-sustaining treatment, including resuscitative measures.
 - B. Hawthorn Surgery Center where you are scheduled to have your procedure wishes to notify you that if there is a need to transfer you to a hospital for additional care measures beyond what the ambulatory facility can provide, your care needs, including your Advance Directive/Living Will/Healthcare Proxy, will be honored at the receiving hospital upon your arrival.
 - C. Hawthorn Surgery Center requests that if you have an Advance Directive/Living Will/Healthcare Proxy, please bring a copy with you so we may place it with your medical record if needed.
 - D. If you do not have an Advance Directive/Living Will/Healthcare Proxy, you may obtain more information, including instructions on how to complete one, at your state authority of Advance Directives/Living Will/Healthcare Proxy. For your convenience, the phone number in Illinois for information is 217-782-4977, the state website is www.idph.state.il.us/public/books/advin.htm, and an Advance Directive form can be provided to you at our center, upon request.

Also, someone from the center will be contacting you prior to your arrival at the center to inform you of your financial responsibility. You may be expected to pay any co-insurance or unmet deductible or co-pay, on the day of service.
